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Abstrak

Abstract

psychology and encouraging positive parental involvement are key factors in promoting academic success.

(Stuart, N., Hart., Brannon, W., 2020) Teachers must understand the psychology of learning to influence children positively. (Sections et al., 2000) School psychologists expanded their role to include the early childhood context, emphasizing assessment, consultation, intervention, and family support. Factors that influence children's social and emotional development include: 1) Interaction with parents and other family members provides an important basis for emotional and social development. 2) Relationships with peers provide opportunities to learn social skills such as sharing, cooperation, and conflict resolution. 3) Schools and teachers play a big role in teaching social skills and managing emotions. 4). Cultural values and social norms influence how children learn to interact with others. 5) Positive and negative experiences can shape the way children manage emotions and interact with other people.

Understanding and supporting children's social and emotional development is key to helping them grow into emotionally healthy individuals capable of interacting positively with others. Strategies to support children's social and emotional development by: 1) Providing emotional support by listening and responding to children's emotional needs with empathy; 2) Teaching children emotional regulation by helping children identify and manage their emotions through techniques such as deep breathing, talking about feelings, and seeking constructive solutions; 3) Encourage Social Interaction by helping children get involved in group activities and playing with peers; 4) Provide examples of positive behavior, by demonstrating good social behavior such as listening, sharing and working together; 5) Teach social skills by teaching skills such as speaking politely, resolving conflicts, and respecting other people's feelings.
